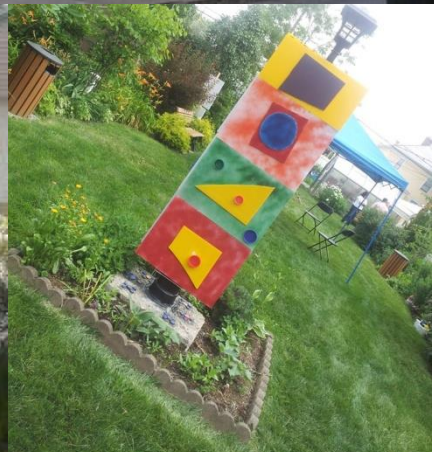


Welcome to Ganthers Place

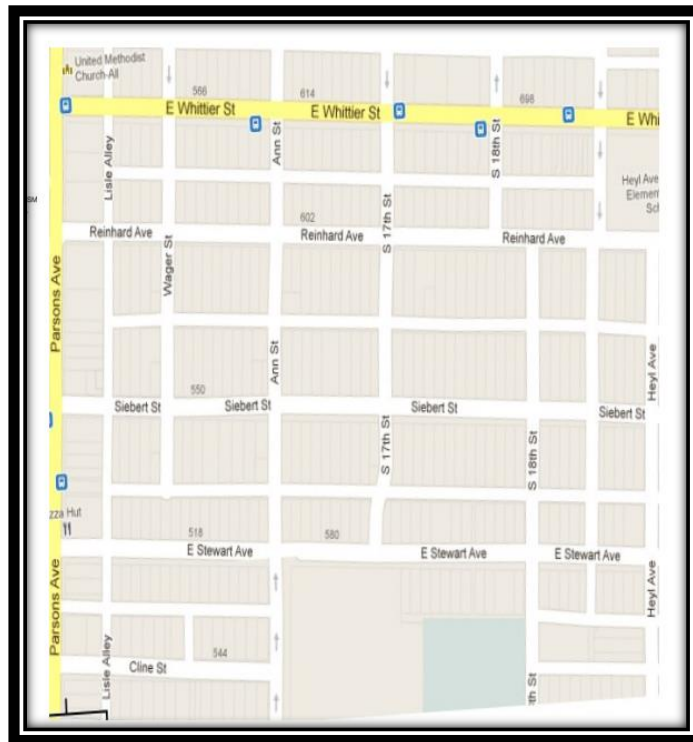
GET INVOLVED!

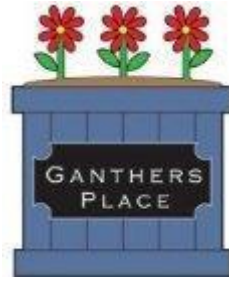
